

Template of an Abstract using L^AT_EX

This is a template of how to format an Abstract for the COSMO / CLM / ICON / ART User Seminar 2017. We accept plain text abstracts, which might contain L^AT_EX commands and formulas. The title, the name(s) of author(s), their affiliation(s) and the text of the abstract have to be input into our web form.

To use L^AT_EX commands, the best is to prepare your abstract within this template without adding any further L^AT_EX packages. Do not use sections, figures, fancy formatting or own macros, e.g., shortcuts for mathematical operators etc. If you can process this document successfully through L^AT_EX, then it will also work in our system.

Author(s) and Affiliation(s) should be specified in exactly the above way as comma-separated lists. In the `\author{}` command, use numbers in brackets after each author's name to indicate different affiliations. Authors with same affiliation should have the same number. In the `\affil{}` command, the affiliation(s) should be listed with the affiliation number in brackets first, followed by the affiliation name, a comma, the next affiliation name, and so on.

Once you are done, please **copy-and-paste** the content of the above `\title{}` command into the "Title of abstract" field of the web form. Similarly, copy-and-paste the content of the `\author{}` command into the "Authors(s)" field and the contents of the `\affil{}` command into the "Affiliation(s)" field.

Finally, copy-and-paste all your text between `\maketitle` and `\end{document}` into the "Abstract" field.
